Names will not be added or removed from the roll between 30th March and 15th April 2025. The Annual Parochial Church Meeting, for which the new roll needs to be prepared, is on 27<sup>th</sup> April at 12.00.

## Stanway Parish

As you know I have always been an SSM (Self-supporting minister) on a part-time, unpaid basis. It will not be possible to continue that arrangement here after I leave in August so the idea is that the parish of Stanway will be served by the same full-time priest as the parish of Shrub End. They have not had an incumbent for over five years and the hope is that someone will be appointed there who will also be licensed to Stanway. Plans for this have already begun and it is anticipated that an appointment could be made in the next few months.

With that in mind the PCC's of the two parishes have met and agreed to have some joint services in our respective churches, so that we can get to know each other

better. This will begin in May with a service at Stanway on the first Sunday of the month and at Shrub End on the fourth. There will be more details about this arrangement in due course, including transport arrangements, but in the meantime do pray for our friends at Shrub End and for the future closer working together.

#### Jansma Park

Stanway Parish Council has published a Public Open Space Consultation for Jasma Park in which they would like the community to participate. Jansma Park is located next to the Westside Centre on London Road. It is a newly acquired greenfield site, and Stanway Parish Council want to ensure it serves the need of the community.

# Giving and Stewardship

Along with most parish churches, St. Albright's relies almost entirely on voluntary giving. We have received grants for specific projects, such as for the new roof and for our pioneering ministry, along with donations and legacies (some very generous) plus fee income from weddings and the like, but the everyday running of the church

and our essential contribution to the wider Church, the diocese, comes from the giving of individuals. There is no state aid or subsidy, something which many find surprising. However, giving to the Church in terms of time and talents as well as money, has always been a fundamental aspect of being a Christian - supporting each other within the Christian community is a firm Biblical principle and one which we achieve at St. Albright's. So giving is not just a worthy and good thing to do, it is an important, vital, part of being Church and of continuing our witness and ministry to the parish.

There is now a clear shortfall between our giving and our outgoings and there will be a circulated shortly to everyone on the electoral roll setting out our financial situation and the importance of Christian stewardship.

These days there are many ways to give:

We now have a new card reader in church so that donations may be made using a debit or credit card.

It is also possible to donate to St. Albright's online. There is a dedicated page on the website to make giving much easier.

If you would like further details about how to give, and there are many ways to do so, then please contact any of the ministry team or churchwardens. We particularly welcome regular giving, however small, either using weekly envelopes or by standing order, and, if you are a taxpayer we can reclaim Gift Aid.

It is also possible to sponsor a day in the life of the church. You may wish to make a one-off donation in memory of someone or to celebrate a particular event. Please contact any of the ministry team or Churchwardens.
